

Despite the progress, the World can see the current usage and production of chemical usage in Syrian Civil War and Israel – Palestine War.

This kind of weapons firstly used in critical ways at the time of WW1. That time we saw the consequences of usage of chemical weapons in humans' health and integrity of nature. The aforementioned weapons also obtained or produced by terrorist organizations. China is deeply concerned about the proliferation of chemical weapons in the hands of non-state actors and recognizes the urgent need for a collective response to address this threat.
