As France, we are one of the leading republics of Europe. Third, it is important that countries are regularly inspected and monitored. These inspections play an important role in ensuring compliance with nuclear weapons agreements and in identifying countries that violate the agreements. We believe that these suggestions and ideas will be an important step towards achieving international nuclear non-proliferation and disarmament goals.
