One of the things that can be done to prevent deaths is; Instructions about keeping the environment clean can be hung on the streets, shopping malls and many other places. Another idea is that we can initiate penalties against doctors who do not vaccinate free of charge in hospitals. Italy also helps global vaccination programs through organizations like the World Health Organization (WHO) and Gavi. Vaccines are important in stopping dangerous diseases like measles, polio, and pneumonia. In addition, Italy supports programs for maternal and child health in poor countries. We work with UNICEF and the World Food Programme (WFP) to fight malnutrition and improve access to clean water and sanitation.
